It's a new kind of financing provided by your Alberta municipality.

Low-cost financing from the Clean Energy Improvement Program is tied to the property, not the property owner.

Repayment is made through property taxes and the financing can transfer to a new owner if the property sells.

This gives property owners the confidence to make deeper retrofits, taking on multiple upgrades at once.

HOW CEIP WORKS

From Start to Finish: The 8 steps to completing your Clean Energy Improvement Program project

1

Pre-Qualification

Ensure you and your property meet the basic eligibility requirements and complete the pre-qualification form at myCEIP.ca.

Documents required: Proof of insurance, Government-issued ID

2

EnerGuide Home Evaluation

Once pre-qualified, schedule an EnerGuide home evaluation to learn about your home's energy performance. This will help you understand your priority options for home improvements.

3

Project Application

Choose a Qualified Contractor from myCEIP.ca/directory and plan your project. Then, submit your Project Application to Alberta Municipalities.

Documents required: Contractor quote, spec sheets for planned upgrades, EnerGuide report, Renovation upgrade report

4

Agreements

Once approved, you'll enter into a Clean Energy Improvement Agreement and Project Agreement.

5

Project Installation

After signing agreements, work with your Qualified Contractor to complete the improvements.

6

Upgrade Completion

Submit Upgrade Completion forms as improvements finish to track progress and trigger payment to Qualified Contractor(s).

Documents required: Contractor invoice, photos of installed upgrades

7

Post-Project EnerGuide Home Evaluation

After all upgrades are completed, a post-project EnerGuide evaluation will provide a new rating and label based on your home's upgrades.

Documents required: Updated EnerGuide Homeowner Information Sheet

8

Repayment

You'll repay the project cost through your municipal property tax bill as per your Clean Energy Improvement Agreement.
